Santa's Workshop Brings Joy to Many!

The Park Building was packed with volunteers and neighbors on Saturday, Dec. 12 for the annual Santa's Workshop.

We estimated about 200 who took photos with Santa, made unique gifts for their families, and enjoyed the refreshments.

Definitely, the stars of the event were the volunteers, some of whom came days before to help prepare, and who started loading and setting up early on the day of the event.

The volunteers helped people create warm fleece ponchos and scarves (using their math skills as they measured and calculated the size for each recipient.)

They showed them how to make simple adjustable belts. They helped them put together plastic ornaments with their own designs and messages.

This year, the families learned how to make inexpensive gift bags, with glue and some holiday paper and ribbon. They decorated bags and cloths with fabric markers, and made leather wrist bands too.

Ms. Wanda Brooks and Ms. Ina McNair showed the young people how to make individual soaps, with the scent and colors they preferred, that could be poured into molds and make a beautiful addition to the home.

One of the busiest sections was the tables where people were making cell phone holders using fabric and duct

Santa was busy, talking with the youngsters and taking a photo with each one, which they could frame with origami for their tree or refrigerator.

Some volunteers helped serve the hot dogs and desserts. Others created gift bags, filled with projects that the kids could do at home.

Christmas carols filled the air as people worked to create nice gifts for others.

Santa was able to give out a large number of gifts directly to the participants, including brand new laptop bags that had been donated for the event.


The frequently used items (paper products, cooking tools, cleaning items) were gathered and put in clear bags, in the shelf nearest the door.

Be Safe During the Holidays!

Traveling:

- -Get an automatic timer for your lights.
- Ask a neighbor to watch your home, shovel snow, and park in the driveway from time to time.
- Have mail and newspaper delivery stopped. If it piles up, it's a sure sign you're gone.

If you're out for the evening:

Turn on lights and a radio or TV so it looks like someone's home.

Be extra cautious about locking doors and windows when you leave, even if it's just for a few minutes.

Don't display gifts where they can be seen from outside.

If you're shopping:

Stay alert and be aware of what's going on around you.

Park in a well-lighted space, and be sure to lock the care, close the windows, and hide shopping bags and gifts in the trunk. Avoid carrying large amounts of cash; pay with a check or credit card whenever possible.

Deter pickpockets and purse-snatchers. Don't overburden yourself with packages. Be extra careful with purses and wallets. Carry a purse close to your body, not dangling by the straps. Put a wallet in an inside coat or front pants pocket. Shopping with kids? Teach them to go to a store clerk or security guard if you get separated.

If stranger comes to the door: Criminals sometime pose as couriers delivering gifts. Some people go door-to-door pretending to ask for charitable donations when there's no charity involved. Ask for identification, and find out how the funds will be used. If you aren't satisfied, don't give. Help a charitable organization you know and like instead.

Avoid stress; Increase joy!

Make time to get together with family, friends, and neighbors. And think about reaching out in the spirit of the season and helping someone who's less fortunate or lonely. Do your part to make the holidays a safe and happy time for everybody- except criminals.

HOW TO REPORT IDENTITY THEFT

Go to the bank and file a report
Get 2 copies, one for the police department and one for your record.

- ☐ Call 301-352-1200 (non-emergency line) of Prince
 Georges County Police Department
 A patrol officer comes to your house and takes a crime
 report. The officer gives you CASE NUMBER. You
 need the case number to report the ID theft to all other
 agencies, financial institutions, utility companies
 (automatic debits), etc.
- □ Call Financial Crimes Unit of PGPD at 301-699-2940 with the police case number
 The unit may not call you back until it gets your case file or has a question. Be patient.
- □ Call Federal Trade Commission (FTC) at 1-877-382-4357*
- □ Call Equifax Fraud Center at 1-800-772-9865
- □ CALL All YOUR FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS and other companies involved and give the case number/s

Make notes for telephone calls and copies of e-mails for your record keeping!

- *when your mail is stolen you need to report it to US
 Postal Inspector Service at 1-877-876-2455 before you
 call FTC
- Be aware of scam e-mails following your ID being stolen!
