
These "Book Houses" are a great place to donate books you no longer want or need as well as take or borrow books! The first Book House is now mounted at 5004 West Lanham Drive.

How to reduce mosquitos

It is summer time and with summer comes seeing more of our favorite insect, the mosquito! Mosquitos are known for transmitting numerous diseases, including Zika Virus. There are already 35 confirmed cases of people infected with the Zika Virus in Maryland. This is especially dangerous to pregnant women, as it affects the unborn child. In order to stave off the spread of diseases carried by mosquitos, here are a few things you can do! Mosquitos need only a table spoon of water to lay their eggs in. So, it's important to remove and dump water from any place

it can collect. This will help eliminate their breeding and multiplication.

Dump water from:

- play buckets - Kids Toys

- Trash cans - Grills

- Empty pools - Swings

- Tarps

Tips to Avoid Mosquito Bites

- -Avoid areas of high mosquito infestation.
 -Avoid unnecessary outdoor activities at dawn and dusk when mosquitoes are most active.
- -Wear long pants, long-sleeve shirt and hat when outdoors.

- -Use mosquito repellents containing DEET (Check with doctor before using on children)
- -Keep children and elderly inside if mosquitoes are active.
- -Anyone with a weakened immune system should take special precautions.
- -Drain all water-holding outdoor containers around the home.
- -Check basements and crawl spaces for flooding, and drain quickly
